October 4, Connecticut Women’s Hall of Fame will provide the speaker on the topic of “Women in Science,” featuring two women currently working at Yale, with a brief introduction about this year’s women in sports who will be inducted into the Hall in their October 20 ceremony.

November 15, Ruth Barnes, the Thomas Jaffe Curator of Yale’s Indo-Pacific Art Collection will give a talk titled, “*Without Cloth We Cannot Marry—the Making and Meaning of Textiles in Eastern Indonesia.*” Ruth will host an in-person visit on December 6 to the actual textiles collection at Yale’s Wurtels Center. Participants in this visit will be limited and more information will follow.

December 13, Jasmina Besirevic-Regan, Assistant Dean at Yale Graduate School and Lecturer in the departments of Sociology and Ethnicity, Race, and Migration, will talk about her research and personal experiences in Bosnia.

Driving from the North or East (New Haven): Take I-95 South to exit 41 (Marsh Hill Rd). At the end of the exit ramp, take a left onto Marsh Hill Rd. At the next traffic light, take a left onto the West Campus Drive/I-95 northbound entrance ramp. Stay in the right lane, check in at the Welcome Center for directions to the Conference Center.

Driving from the South or West (New York): Take exit 41 and go straight ahead at the end of the exit ramp, across Marsh Hill Rd, onto the northbound entrance ramp. Follow this to the fork, stay in the right lane, and check in at the Welcome Center for directions to the Conference Center.
